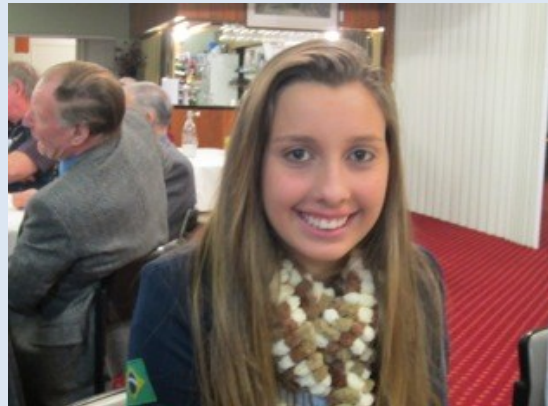
Is seeking helpers to erect the bike race barriers on Friday 28/10 from 4.30pm, and also to dismantle them on Saturday after the race.

Julia gave an excellent and informative slideshow presentation on herself, her family, and her country of Brazil, a country which she is very proud of.

Julia's immediate family consists of her father Gastao, mother Claudia, elder sister Bruna, and her younger brother Lucas.

Julia is very active playing basketball, handball, volleyball, judo, and her biggest sporting love is soccer which she plays at a high level and watches regularly. She is looking forward to the 2014 World Cup being held in Brazil with games being played in her home city.

Julia and her family live in the city of Belo Horizonte which is the capital of and largest city in the state of Minas Gerais is located in the south eastern region of Brazil. It is the third largest metropolitan area in the country. Belo Horizonte has a population of over 2.4 million, or almost 5.4 million in the official Metropolitan Area.

Julia is active in social work. She is part of a group of approximately 90, 15 to 19 year olds called Teenagers of Christ who undertake charity work every Sunday afternoon.

Julia attends a school with a reputation of being the 3rd best in Brazil where she studies the standard 16 subject. School is from 7am to 1 pm, and also from 4 to 9 pm Mondays and Wednesdays, plus tests every Friday from 4 to 9 pm.
